ROLLING START ROLL OUT!

After a successful trial of the rolling start this term for the children across Key Stage 2, this will now be in operation across the whole school from September. Doors will open to **all** children at 8:40am whereupon they will come into school and start on their Mental Maths activities. This means that the children will not need to line up and be walked down to the classrooms by their teachers, instead they will filter in as they arrive. For all children in Key Stage 1, please continue to use the door from the Key Stage 1 playground to enter school. For our Key Stage 2 children, you should continue to enter school from the back playground as usual.

LIBRARY PLANS:

Our scheme of building works over the summer has been somewhat delayed after complications with the supply of materials.

Because of this delay, it is likely that some works will remain outstanding when we return in September. The builder's storage area will still be in place on the front car park and this will limit access for all parents. It also means, disappointingly, that our new library will be far from ready to open to the children and probably will not be ready until the end of September. Whilst our vision for a wonderful learning space is alive and well, the big reveal will be delayed until later in the term. Frustrating!

EPIC UPDATE:

EPIC fundraising and spending this year

Once again we can report back to you on a great year of fundraising, with an incredible £9,500 raised by the end of the year. This is on top of a £5,000 boost from the Cop Community Fund, £700 of donations from fundraising at The Angel and another £200 from the Co-op.

As a result, this week EPIC passed a donation of £15,640 to the school as a substantial contribution towards the redevelopment of the library.

As well as this we have contributed £200 towards Golden Letter rewards and £250 towards the Year 6 leavers trip to Alpamare this week, as well as small contributions to school social events, including lollies for sports day! In total, this all amounts to almost £16,500 of donations to school.

We expect to be starting the next academic year with around £4,000 carried over and hope to build on this with some further investments in the library and Learning Hub, and perhaps some new ideas too.
