Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been a really busy week as teachers put the finishing few touches to the school reports and start the assessment of children's skills so that we can report accurately on their achievements to you in the coming weeks. Part of this assessment has been the Phonics Screening Check which was completed with all children in Year 1 last week. Each child spent about 4 minutes with Mrs Bamma as they read 40 words (both real and made up) to test their phonic skills. The outcomes of the check will be reported in your child's end of year report.

### **CO-OP THANKS:**

### **TEXT MESSAGES:**

Recent feedback from the Parent Forum Meeting means that we are going to reduce the number of text messages we send out. Our text message system was only ever intended to provide swift communication for urgent messages, for example the recent school closures as a result of bad weather. However, we have been made aware that some parents feel this is now being overused and is eroding the effectiveness of this form of communication. We will now 'sense check' our communications and consider whether the information can wait until Friday's newsletter before sending this out to you. Furthermore, we will target our audience more carefully so you only receive text messages that are pertinent to you and your child. This means that the content of our newsletter will need to be carefully digested so that you don't miss out on key dates and changes! Hopefully this change will lead to less duplication of information.

Please can all Learning Journeys be returned to school as soon as possible so that we can finalise our assessments and use this information to complete the end of year reports.

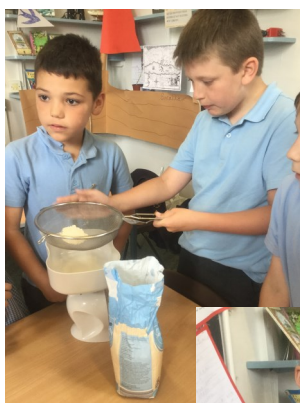
### **YEAR 1/2 NEWS:**

Some children are now coming to the end of their maths books and so they will be sent home with their homework on a sheet to complete due to the limited time left in the school year.

### **YEAR 3/4 NEWS:**

This week Year 3 and 4 children have been practising their measuring skills. They baked cakes for their homework and made Welsh cakes in their Maths lesson on Wednesday. The children have really improved their ability to convert measures, measure accurately and read scales. The cakes were delicious. Why don't you try to make some at home this weekend?



### **Welsh Cakes Recipe:**

8oz self-raising flour

2oz castor sugar

4oz margarine or butter

1 or 2 handfuls of sultanas

1 or 2 eggs depending on mixture

### **Method:**

(Makes around 10-12)

- Sieve flour into bowl, then add margarine or butter, rub in finely together.
- Add sugar and sultanas and mix.
- Add 1 egg and mix. The consistency needs to be bound together, so if too dry add another egg.
- Roll out on a floured board, to about a quarter inch thick.
- Cut using a 2 inch (approx) cutter, then cook on a greased pan or bake stone, on a medium heat for about 4 to 5 minutes each side.
- The exact cooking length will depend on what you are cooking your Welsh cakes on, but keep a close eye - too short a period and they won't be cooked in middle, and cooked for too long and they will be dry. When touched during cooking they should feel springy but not wet to the touch (no mixture should come out of the middle).
- Once cooked dust with castor sugar and enjoy.

### **FIRE SAFETY:**

Your child may have come home recently with lots of questions and information about your home Fire Safety. This is because North Yorkshire Fire & Rescue Service came into school to talk to our Year 5/6 children about the role of the service in the Community and also provided Fire Safety advice for the children to follow up at home. Information was given about a number of common causes of fire and the children were advised about things such as:

- Not cooking without adult supervision.
- Not to play with matches or lighters and to ask an adult to put them away safely.
- Turning off electrical equipment when not in use.
- Not to charge mobile phones or tablets overnight and turn off chargers when not in use.

They were also asked to check that there is at least one working smoke alarm per floor at home and to test them once a month. If you don't have smoke alarms, if they don't work when tested or are over 10 years old the Fire Service offer a free home safety visit, during which they can test any alarms and fit extras or replacements if needed. The motto 'Get Out, Dial 999 and Stay Out' was also highlighted together with the recommendation that each home has an escape plan so that everyone knows what they should do in the event of an emergency.
