Dear Parents,

What a half term we have had with sleepovers, residential visits to Whitby, SATs, trips to Beamish and introductions to New Starters! We'll all be glad of some time to take a breath before returning to school for the last half term of the year. School opens after half term on Monday 4th June as normal.

### **E-SAFETY UPDATE:**

It has been evident over the past few weeks that many of our young people's conversations are dominated by the most recently talked about game: 'Fortnite'. Pitting player against player in an online multiplayer arena, players must work together to fight foes, build weapons or be the last man standing. Although it has some features that are similar to Minecraft, Fortnite relies more heavily on combat situations and more aggressive game play. Askaboutgames.com have explained that:

"In the UK, the Video Standards Council rate Fortnite as PEGI 12 for frequent scenes of mild violence. It is not suitable for persons under 12 years of age. The VSC expand on the PEGI rating by stating that, "Violence consists of you using whatever weapons you can find or make to fend off the monsters of the Storm and save the survivors. Damage is dealt by numbers and life bars and monsters disappear in a purple flash when defeated."

As teachers have been seeing an increased number of complaints and disagreements within school relating to game play and events occurring over headset conversations, including anger when losing a game, swearing between children and teasing others when they have made a mistake, we would like to actively encourage parents to talk to their children about this game.
