



As part of our safeguarding procedures and our efforts to keep every child safe we wish to inform you that we have children in school who have an allergy to nuts. Therefore, please be aware that our school is now a 'nut free' school and please refrain from bringing any products containing nuts onto the premises. Thank you for your support with this.

Welcome back to this, our final half term of the year. We have now set our class structure and classes for next year and you should receive your child's class list by the end of next week. This is slightly earlier than usual but with all parental and professional concerns addressed it seems unhelpful to keep class lists confidential until later in the year. The classes have taken a great deal of work to organise and as such are now set. Whilst myself or class teachers are happy to explain our reasoning behind any decisions, no movement of pupils into different classes will happen.

NUT FREE SCHOOL:

We are now officially a nut free school. I would ask that this is respected by everyone and consideration is given to what is sent in for packed lunches. A few children are still eating products that are made from or contain nuts—such as Nutella pots. Please help us to safeguard children with severe allergies by not sending products with nuts in.

SAFEGUARDING AGAINST ALLERGIES:

Those of you with children who have allergies and carry Epipens or Asthma inhalers will receive a letter from me next week seeking permission from you for us to administer adrenaline or Salbutamol in the event of your child's Epipen or inhaler failing or being misplaced. We have taken advantage of the change to legislation that allows schools to purchase spare (AAI—Auto Adrenaline Injectors and Inhalers) and now have these stored securely in school. This marks a positive step in dealing safely with pupils who have medical needs and I would urge you to return the permission forms immediately.

STAFF CHANGES:

At the end of this year Mrs Mackenzie will leave us to take up a post at a school in York. We will be sad to see her leave but wish her all the best in her new adventures.

Miss Pearton will also be leaving at the end of the year to pastures new and we wish them both well for the future.

READING BOOKS:

At the start of the year we purchased a significant number of new reading books for Key Stage 1. These have nearly all vanished, either lost or left at home. Please can these be returned asap as we start to order our current stock in readiness for September. Next year all books will be contained in the new library and children will 'check books' in and out. From next year a charge will be levied for books that have been lost so it's important we start the year with as much of our current stock as possible.

BELARUSIAN VISITORS:

On Monday 25th and Tuesday 26th June we are hosting 11 Belarusian children as part of their visit to the UK. These children come from a very different background to our own children at school and often do not have the benefits that our children experience. We are therefore hoping to collect any clothing, footwear, toiletries, games and sweets that you may be willing to donate. These charitable donations will then be sorted by the charity and sent back with the children when they return.

Please bring any gifts/donations in to the school entrance where there will a donation area from Monday next week so that we can gather them together and pass them onto to the visit organisers. The children are both male and female and range from the age of 10 to 11.

This is a really exciting opportunity for our children to mix with children of different cultural backgrounds, life experiences and beliefs and so we hope you will support us by sending in any donations you can.

CLASSES AND ORGANISATION NEXT YEAR:

Thank you so much to everyone who emailed in to give us their views on the class structure for next year. After long discussions we believe we have been able to meet everyone's preferences which has only been possible because of the positive way in which parents responded to the consultation...thank you.

We will now process the class lists and these will come out to you a little earlier than previously anticipated. You will receive your child's new class list next week so please do look out for these in your child's book bag towards the back end of the week.

I am now in a position to confirm classes for next year, although some unknowns exist as a result of changes to staffing from September.

EARLY YEARS (RECEPTION):

Miss Welburn will be retained as our Reception teacher from September and will work with the Reception Class. The Early Years have experienced a great deal of change lately and Miss Welburn has gained the experience and skills to continue to develop this quality provision into next year. Mr Pearce and Mrs Bamma will oversee the work of the Early Years and will be supported in doing so by colleagues from other schools.

RECEPTION AND YEAR 1 CLASS:

Mrs Green and Mrs Cooper will share the responsibility for this class. Mrs Cooper is an incredibly experienced and talented Early Year's teacher who has much experience of teaching Key Stage 1. Mrs Green is also experienced and highly skilled in the Key Stage 1 age range. The skills of both teachers will ensure that this class gets excellent teaching and provision throughout the year.

YEAR 1 AND YEAR 2 CLASSES:

Mrs Hesketh remains in Year 1/2 and brings a wealth of experience to this role. Mrs Bamma will also stay in Year 1/2 to build on the great work undertaken this year. Between them we have a huge amount of experience and skill to deliver high outcomes for our Key Stage 1 children. Mrs Bamma will also remain as the Key Stage 1 leader and is the first port of call for any issues you may have throughout the year.

YEAR 3 AND YEAR 4 CLASSES:

Mrs Cottrell remains in Year 3/4 and will continue to lead this phase in school. The remaining teaching post for the Year 3/4 class will be advertised and a suitable candidate appointed in time for September.

YEAR 5 AND YEAR 6 CLASSES

We are delighted that Miss Kempf will remain as our Year 5 class teacher whilst Miss Potter and Miss Hill take the Year 6 children forward in their learning. This represents a really strong team for our Upper School. Miss Potter is your first point of contact for any concerns you may have with either Year 5 or Year 6 provision.

TEACHING ASSISTANTS:

As a result of budgetary implications our Teaching Assistant structure will not be finalised until the very end of the year. The Teaching Assistants working in the classes next year will be shared through the Year Group Newsletters in September.

OFFICE TEAM:

No changes to our Office Team next year. Mrs Gibson and Mrs Hamill will continue to deal with all the administrative tasks that cross their desks over the course of the year as well as being your point of help whenever you call or pop into school.

SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS:

Mrs Exelby will continue her outstanding work next year, working with children and families who require additional support to enable them to access a broad and balanced curriculum. We are thrilled that Mrs Exelby will continue to be non-class based next year as her work over the last year has been invaluable in securing really high quality provision for children with additional and special needs.
